

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

On 11-4-97 Ralph Baney, Wayne Staley and myself responded to the Jackson County Sheriff's Department to process a vehicle. Upon arrival we were met by Sgt. Gary Kilgore who is investigating this case. We were directed to the vehicle which was located in the evidence storage room. The vehicle was a 1993 Honda Accord LX, VIN 1HGCB7250PA025138 , Mo. license T5B 721 Oct.

A scrape was present on the front passenger bumper. It was related that this scrape occurred before this homicide. A light coating of soil was present on the tires. This coating was too light for collection. No accumulation of soil was observed in any of the wheel wells. No obvious blood was observed on the inside or outside of this vehicle. Luminol was sprayed on the interior of this vehicle. No significant activity with the luminol was observed, indicative of the absence of blood.*

Sgt. Kilgore presented photographs of tire tracks at the scene. Ralph Baney compared those tire tracks to the tires on this vehicle. All of the tires were Michelin P 185/70R14 87T M+S. Ralph Baney told Sgt. Kigore that the tires on this vehicle did not make the tracks in the photographs. **

* Kelly Moffett claimed that the gun was hastily tossed into the trunk after the shooting (see Kelly Moffett, Statement 4, 09-21-00, page 13), saying "And really quickly Byron just like threw the thing in the, the gun in the trunk again, you know like opened it up , threw it in there." The Medical Examiner's Report clearly states that Anastasia died from a contact gunshot blast to the nose, a detail that Kelly Moffett got wrong, and one that would have meant the depositing of Anastasia's DNA from back-spatter on the barrel of the gun, thereby transferring it to the trunk in which she claimed it was immediately tossed.

**Tire impressions were taken from the scene at the southwest corner of the island near where Anastasia's body was found. The tire impressions did not match Justin's vehicle. No other vehicles were compared for a possible match.
