On 04-01-98, at approximately 1945 hrs., Sgt. George Jones contacted me at my residence. Sgt. Jones informed me Robert Witbolsfeugen had called the office and needed to talk to me immediately. Mr. Witbolsfeugen left a telephone number of 531-8683 to contact him at.

I contacted Mr. Witbolsfeugen at the number given and he informed me that he had located a vehicle he had been looking for parked in the alley way next to Tara McDowell's apartment building. Mr. Witbolsfeugen stated the vehicle is a Pontiac Sunbird, marine green in color, expired license plates, a large crevice on the driver's door, decals are in the window, the license on the vehicle was 131AWY. Mr. Witbolsfeugen stated this was the second or third car in the procession of cars that night of the murder.

I asked Mr. Witbolsfeugen what he was doing at Tara's and he said his daughter was a resident at a psychiatric center at 63<sup>rd</sup> & 71 Hwy. and he thought he would stop at Karen Turner's residence to visit (location I called him at). On the way to Turner's, he stopped at Tara McDowell's apartment building and thought he would walk around awhile. This is when he discovered the vehicle.

Mr. Witbolsfeugen wanted me to send a tow truck to have the vehicle towed away because of the expired license plates. I explained to Mr. Witbolsfeugen there was no law broken if a car was parked on private property with expired license plates.

On 04-01-98, at approximately 1050 hrs., I contacted Mr. Robert Witbolsfeugen. The contact was made in response to a message from Mr. Witbolsfeugen to do so.

At that time, Mr. Witbolsfeugen inquired about his credibility with the information he is providing. I told Mr. Witbolsfeugen the information received by him was taken and not thrown away. Mr. Witbolsfeugen then asked if he was a suspect in this case. I told Mr. Witbolsfeugen that anyone in the area near the time Anastasia was killed would be suspect.

Mr. Witbolsfeugen then informed me that if I didn't believe him then I would have a problem. I perceived this comment as a threat and I cautioned him about making threats toward me.

Mr. Witbolsfeugen asked about the officer he knows as Deputy 66. Mr. Witbolsfeugen wanted to know if I had found out if Deputy 66 was the one that found Anastasia's body. I told Mr. Witbolsfeugen that I had never questioned who found Anastasia's body because I knew who the Deputy was that found the body.

Mr. Witbolsfeugen then assumed that the Deputy 66 was the one that found the body and I told him that Deputy was not the one that found her body. Mr. Witbolsfeugen then began making the comparison to the initials of the Deputy that found the body and the initials of Deputy 66, which are the same. Mr. Witbolsfeugen was told even though the initials are the same, the Deputies are different.

Mr. Witbolsfeugen then stated that since the initials were the same then I could understand his concern. I told him that I did not understand his concern. (Witbolsfeugen believing a Deputy was involved with the death of his daughter).
