SUPPLEMENT TO Homicide COMPLAINT # S-97-11829

On this date at 0734 hrs, I was dispatched to Lincoln Cemetery, Blue-Ridge Blvd. and Stark street to contact member(s) of the Indep. Mo. Police Dept. regarding a suspicious auto possibly related to the above case. Upon arrival contact was made with member(s) of the aforementioned agency who advised they had been checking the cemetery regarding an unrelated incident.

The above agency advised that while checking the cemetery they discovered a Blue Chev 4-dr bearing mo lic. 920-FPA within the cemetery and a Mr. Withelstengen in the area as well.

Contact was then made with Mr. Withelstengen near the described vehicle which was parked just West of and inside the East entrance of the cemetery.

Upon checking with Dept. Commander Capt. Phillips, it was learned that Mr. Withelstengen, the father of the homicide victim and the described vehicle were not being sought in connection to the case.

While speaking with Mr. Withelstengen, I inquired if he remembered and/or has learned of any information that may help further the investigation that has not already been given to investigators?

Mr. Withelstengen advised that the victim, his daughter had been dating a young man from Oklahoma, Justin Beaton w/m 20 years who was attending an area college.

Mr. Withelstengen advised that this subject was adopted and he believed his birth name to be Justin Beilly.

Mr. Withelstengen advised that on the evening prior to the discovery of the crime, he had spoken with Justin on the phone at about 2220 hrs.

Mr. Withelstengen advised that Justin had informed him that he, Justin and the victim had been arguing.

Mr. Withelstengen advised that Justin informed him that he, Justin had dropped his daughter off in the area of 24-Hwy and I-435 and/or Truman Rd and I-435 but was not sure which.

Mr. Withelstengen advised that he responded into these areas, the area of Mt. Washington Cemetery. Cont. →

Mr. Witholsfengen advised that while in this area, Mt. Washington Cemetery, he heard what he believed was a gun shot echoing through the area.


I then asked Mr. Witholsfengen why he had responded to this area today.
